College Visits - **Virtually


- Register for a tour/visit still the best option to show interest



 - Personalized review questions by your own strengths/weakness








SAT vs. ACT

- Colleges accept either the SAT or ACT
- In your packet is a breakdown of the specific differences
- <u>SAT</u> creative questions critical thinking skills
 - Based on 1600 score 800 each Math/Reading-Writing
- <u>ACT</u> straightforward testing knowledge
 - 1-36 score
- We encourage you to take at least one test in the spring of your Junior year.
- Colleges do "Superscore"
- Some are cross referencing SAT/ACT



Test Optional?

Majority of schools are now Test Optional. (about 80%)

Test Optional - Student decides if they want to send or not

<u>Test Blind</u> - The school does NOT consider scores, even if they are sent.

<u>Test Flexible</u> - (newer) - can opt to send other tests (AP/IB)

<u>Common Data Set</u> - Each school publishes yearly data of admissions information (school site) Ex: Rutgers

- 42,000 applied 28,000 accepted 7,800 enrolled
- Effects colleges look to be more selective, so only send if they benefit you!

College Testing.....cont.

- It is recommended to take either SAT/ACT at least twice
- Enclosed in your packet are the test dates for 2023-2024
- When registering for the SAT/ACT you can select four schools to receive scores at no extra charge, after it is \$14.00/18.50 per school
- SAT/ACT both require a picture to be uploaded when registering







Accessing Naviance

- Your child is registered and can log in using their school email
- Go To Morris Knolls Website → School Counseling
 Department → MK Naviance Students or APA Students
- Parents can request to have their own access by emailing their child's school counselor








Junior Year Cont'd

Students will also be directed to utilize "Supermatch" or "Advanced College Search" accessible under the 'College' tab to begin exploring colleges.








During Junior Year

Students will develop a list of reach, target and safety schools in their - "Colleges that I'm Thinking About" tab (consider acceptance rates and financial means)








Needed for Senior Year

- Students are required to complete:
 - "Senior Brag Sheet"
 - Can complete over the summer
 - "Parent Brag Sheet" (Parents may access this sheet using their own Naviance account)
 - These will be referenced when writing letters of recommendation.









Senior Year – Applications

- By senior year update Naviance by moving the college from "Colleges that I'm <u>Thinking</u> About" → "Colleges I'm <u>Applying</u> To"
- Letters of Recommendation (2)— teacher requests need to be entered "Colleges Home tab"

What are colleges looking for?

- This will vary depending on how competitive and how large
 - Transcript academic achievement growth GPA
 - Standardized Test Scores (if not sending other parts of application will be scrutinized more, like academic rigor/grades)
 - Class Rank
 - Rigor of Schedule and Senior Year schedule
 - Activities consistency commitment leadership
 - Volunteer work etc.
 - Showing Interest
 - Essays Supplements
 - Recommendations
 - Interview only a few private require



The Application



- No set rule, 6-9 applications is average
- Safety, target and reach
- Refer to Freshman Class Profile, Data Sets and compare yourself on Naviance
- Common Application, Coalition or college website
- Each college has separate deadlines/requirements/fees
 be aware of each
- If they request "Official Test Scores" even if you self report in the CA you must send them
- Counselor will submit: School Profile/Transcript School Report/Letters of Rec

Common App & Coalition App

- One application can be used for more than one college
 - Many schools have supplemental questions/essay
- Payment made right on the website
- One required essay for the application (max 650)
 - Start your essay before school begins in September
- Application can be started early! (It will roll-over to your senior year application on August 1 and automatically populate information)
