Dear Morris Hills Regional District Community:

The Morris Hills Regional Board of Education prohibits acts of harassment, intimidation, or bullying of a student. A safe and civil environment in school is necessary for students to learn and achieve high academic standards. Harassment, intimidation, or bullying, like other disruptive or violent behaviors, is conduct that disrupts both a student's ability to learn and a school's ability to educate its students in a safe and disciplined environment. The Morris Hills Regional District prides itself on providing a safe learning environment for all of its students.

Harassment, intimidation, or bullying is defined under N.J.S.A. 18A:37-14: as:

“Any gesture, written, verbal or physical act, or electronic communication, whether a single incident or series of incidents, AND

That is reasonably perceived as being motivated either by any actual or perceived characteristic, such as race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression or a mental, physical or sensory disability, or by any other distinguishing characteristic, AND

That takes place on school property, at any school-sponsored function, on a school bus or off school grounds that substantially disrupts or interferes with the orderly operation of the school, AND that:

- a. a reasonable person should know will have the effect of physically or emotionally harming a student or damaging the student's property, or placing the student in reasonable fear of physical or emotional harm to his person or property; or
- b. has the effect of insulting or demeaning any student or group of students in such a way as to cause substantial disruption in, or substantial interference with, the orderly operation of the school;
- c. creates a hostile environment at school; or
- d. infringes on the rights of the student at school.”

The Morris Hills Regional District takes a proactive approach to educating its students with regard to harassment, intimidation, and bullying. Morris Knolls High School and Morris Hills High School

conduct various programs and meetings throughout the school year to address HIB and create a safe environment for all of its students. These include the following:

- Class Meetings
- Stand Up - Speak Up - End Bullying Program
- Week of Respect
- Postcard Project
- Kindness Grams
- Bully Documentary Program
- Character Education curriculum
- HIB Committee meetings throughout the school year
- Presentations in the health classes
- Presentations by the local police department
- Anti-bullying Focus Groups
- Utilization of HIBSTER software.
